New York State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR)

- Protection of Waters permits (DEC)
- Coastal Erosion Management permits (DEC)
- Cultural Resources Information Submittals (SHPO)
- Coastal Zone Consistency Review (DOS)
- Underwater land easements (OGS)
- Amendment to zoning ordinance (Common Council)
- Special use permits, variances (ZBA)
- Site plan review (Planning Board)



SEQR Process

- SEQR will commence with an Environmental Assessment Form (EAF)
- Lead Agency will issue a Determination of Significance
- Actions with significant environmental impacts will require an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)
- EIS can be project specific (e.g., flat-rock beach) or generic (e.g., full waterfront redevelopment)



SEQR Process

Generic EIS

- GEIS identifies potential impacts from a broader perspective over a larger geographic area
- Appropriate for initiatives that involve multiple, smaller projects
- Uses hypothetical scenarios and reasonable assumptions to set thresholds of impacts
- If implementation will surpass those thresholds, additional review may be required
- Completion of EIS process typically takes 6-12 months or more with report production, comment periods, etc.
