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What is the Mural Project?

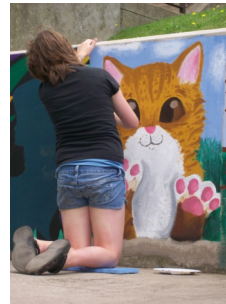
In 2009 the Mayor of Oswego asked a group of youth serving agencies to try and address the graffiti issues in the City by having young people create and paint murals along the Linear Park.

The idea was that if young people create these murals they are less likely to be areas targeted by 'taggers'.

In 2009 the Oswego High School created the first mural which is located on the west side railroad truss.

The project has continued each year since with the murals being created directly on the concrete along Linear Park.

The murals are designed and created by student artists of all ages and abilities. All murals on public property must be approved by the Common Council prior to painting.



How do you get involved?

If you or someone you know would like to be involved you simply need to give us a call.

The project is always looking for youth artists, adult mentors and donations to help out with the project.

Since we mostly work on projects outside, our group begins working on projects in early spring and continue until early fall.
