### WRIGHT’S LANDING/ OSWEGO INTERNATIONAL MARINA (A DEEP WATER MARINA)

**C**onveniently located at the intersection of the NYS canal system and Lake Ontario. Owned and operated by the City of Oswego, the marinas feature 175 (Wright’s Landing) and 66 (Oswego International Marina) seasonal boat slips. Slips are available with or without electric and water hookup; sizes range from 20- to 60-feet. Transient slips, a 3- to 4-lane boat launch, fish cleaning station, 24-hour rest room and showers, boat pump-out are available. Night time security provided. Fishing licenses available at ticket booth. Open May 1 – Oct. 15. For information on rates and dockage call 315-342-8167 or the ticket booth at 315-343-8430. Ticket booth is open late April to Oct. 15 from 4 a.m. to 8 p.m.

### OSWEGO MARINA



**L**ocated on the east side of the Oswego River and owned and operated by the Port of Oswego Authority, the Oswego Marina serves both charter boats and recreational crafts. With more than 65 slips and commercial dock space available, the marina can accommodate any size recreation or commercial fishing vessel. Rest rooms, showers and laundry, cleaning station, boat pump-out, gas/diesel dock, fishing store. Onsite 12-site RV park opening May 1, 2020. Winter and summer storage available. Hoist up to 35 feet.
